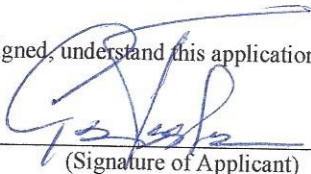

To assist the Board of Commissioners in making appointments to the Land Development Ordinances Advisory Board ("Advisory Board"), please respond briefly to the following questions. There is no right or wrong answer. Your responses will provide a framework for discussion with the Mayor and Commissioners.

Overview: The Advisory Board consists of eight (8) voting members appointed by the Board of Commissioners. The Regular membership shall consist of six (6) members who reside within the corporate limits, or extraterritorial zoning jurisdiction ("ETJ").

1. Please describe the areas of community service in which you have participated, in Huntersville or elsewhere.

Served on McLox Crossing HOA Board for 7 of 8 years.
Served as Huntersville Rep. on Connect Consortium for 4 years.
Served on Greenway, Trails and Bikeway Commission for 6 years.
Served on Energy United Member Advisory Committee for 4 years.
Serve as volunteer for Kairos Prison Ministry (continuing)
Member of two churches, doing marriage mentoring work

2. Briefly describe your vision for Huntersville in the next 10 to 15 years. What factors during that time will shape the growth of our community?

Connect Consortium sees regional population doubling by 2050.
We are ill-prepared in most sectors for this level of growth.
Increasing population density will challenge transportation, education, health and recreation, and environmental venues.
We must do a better job of planning, then enforcing zoning and development ordinances, and reset our expectations as outcomes.

3. With rapid development occurring in Huntersville and the surrounding area, the character and growth patterns of our community are changing rapidly. Please discuss briefly any problems that you perceive, anything that you would like to change, and/or anything you find particularly appropriate to Huntersville.

As discussed by the Mayor and The Board, town zoning and development ordinances must be evaluated to assess and remove outdated and overly-restrictive ordinances and covenants. In addition to looking "backward", we also must look "forward" to evaluate and adopt new procedures to incorporate technologies like solar, wind, and geothermal energy production; increasing use of electric vehicles; and more diversity in residential/commercial design to avoid

OTHER COMMENTS: "cookie-cutter" appearance, sprawl, etc.

Huntersville #101 and Citizens' Police Academy are excellent programs. Town might offer more opportunities for citizens to participate in day-to-day town business as volunteers, to support maintenance of favorable tax rates and limited town staffing requirements.
