Re: Waiver of sixty-day notice of intent to annex

Dear Mr. Hagemann:

The Town of Huntersville has received a Petition for a voluntary, contiguous annexation of certain property located on the corner of Heritage Vista Drive and Fred Brown Road proposes Centennial subdivision Phase 6 (PIN: 01926102); see the enclosed map. The purpose of this letter is to give the required sixty-day (60) notice under the Annexation or Sphere of Influence Agreement by and between the Town of Huntersville and the City of Charlotte.

This voluntary annexation is a contiguous annexation pursuant to the provisions of North Carolina General Statute 160A-31, et seq.
